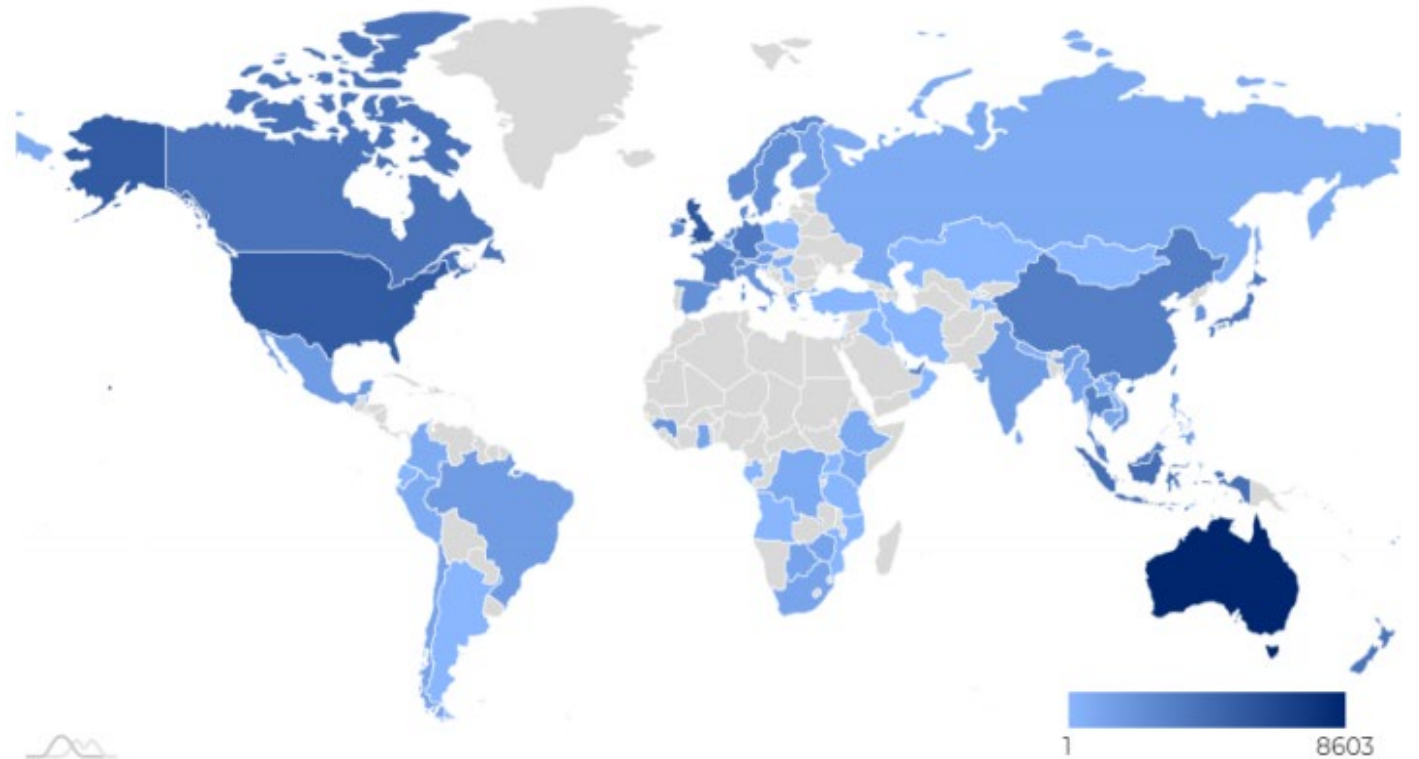

Program structure – dual program

Bachelor of Arts dual program structure

BA component

32 units / 16 courses

- 2 single majors (2 x 16 units) OR
- 1 extended Major (24 units) + 1 minor (8 units)

No general elective courses

Dual component

Depends on your dual program – 17 to choose from. You will need to seek advice from the other faculty about program structure.

UQ Terminology

Degree = program

Subject = courses

2 units = 1 course (mostly)

Tips

- All dual programs are owned/administered by one of the associated faculties.
- You need to communicate with the program-owning faculty about your overall enrolment.
- You can always contact HASS Student Admin with questions about the BA component of your dual degree.

Where do I start – Dual degree

If you are in the dual degree, **get your foundation right**

Example: Xi is doing a Bachelor of Arts / Laws (Honours). In his BA, he wants to do an extended major in Art History and a minor in Sociology. He picks two introductory (Level 1) compulsory courses offered in Semester 1 for Law. Then he picks two introductory courses for his BA extended major and minor. This sets a good foundation for his study in future semesters.

Where do I start

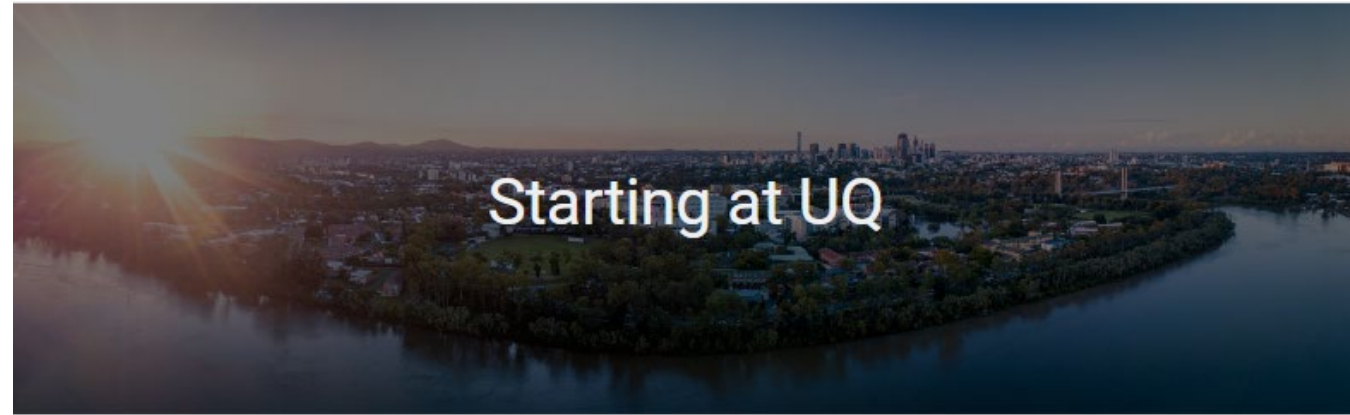
You can find your program requirements on the [Bachelor of Arts Dual](#) page.

It is important that you are familiar with these requirements so that you complete the program you want in the relevant amount of time.

Don't forget the 8-unit rule when choosing your courses in the BA. This means your first 8 units must be chosen from BA courses. This includes course from BA majors and minors and BA program electives. You cannot choose general elective courses outside of these areas for your first 8 units.
