



Reality: Humanities graduates get jobs and good ones

2/3 of chief executives of ASX200 listed companies have degrees in humanities *

62% of government senior executives and 66% of federal parliamentarians have a degree in the humanities*

86.6% is the overall employment rate of recent graduates in humanities, culture and social sciences **

\$66.7k is the amount humanities, culture and social science graduates earn straight out of university in fulltime employment. **



Structure of the single degree BA






What is an Elective?

Courses that allow you to customise your degree further.

- Can be from study areas outside of your Major or Minor (called General Elective)
- Can be additional courses from your Major course lists (called BA Electives).
- You 'unlock' electives:

You MUST to take 8 units (1 semester) of required courses from the BA course list before you can start taking General Electives.






And here's where your degree gets REALLY powerful!

You can USE these electives to build or add another Major or Minors!

And, if you like them better, you can switch!

(anytime so long as you have room in your 48 units to still graduate on time)

Your BA just became the ultimate *choose-yourown adventure* degree!





Where do I start?

For single degree BA, keep your options open and explore:

Example: Kris: majoring in International Relations and Philosophy; but loves Music and Criminology.

They pick one compulsory introductory course from each area.


Kris decides Crim & Philosophy aren't for them: No problem, they switch to IR & Music majors and those Crim & Philosophy course acts as electives for their degree.

Make sure to take Level 1 courses in your first semester, unless you have credit for prior learning

Where do I start?

For dual degree students, get your foundation right

Example: Xi studies Bachelor of Arts / Laws (Honours).

In his BA, he wants to do an extended major in Art History and a minor in Sociology.

He picks two introductory (Level 1) compulsory courses for Law, and two introductory courses for his BA extended major and minor (1 each).

Information for students commencing

2023

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Complete 48 units comprising:

- 32 units for BA Courses, and
- 16 units for BA Elective Courses

Selected courses must include at most 24 units at level 1.

No more than 32 units may be completed from courses with the same discipline descriptor.
