Program = Degree or study area eg: Bachelor of Arts


Major/Plan = Study Areas eg: History, French

Course = Subject/Class eg: PHSS2000


Unit (#) = Value of the course eg: 2 (almost always 2)

Semester = Duration of courses eg: approximately 16 weeks





## Your Program

#### Important notes about your program:

- Education degree 'owned' and managed by HASS
- Non-education degree is 'owned' and managed by that faculty
  - Arts HASS faculty;
  - Music HASS
  - Business Management BEL
  - Mathematics Science
  - Science Science

## Program Structure

There are two parts to your program:

- Part A: Bachelor of Education + non-Education degree (3 years)
- Your non-Education degree provides the content required to teach your chosen subjects
- Part B: Bachelor of Education Professional Year (1 Year)
- Your Education degree provides the skills, knowledge and practical experience to teach in schools



## Organisation of Professional Experience

- The School of Education Placement Officers organise ALL professional experience placements
- The University is governed by an Industrial Agreement where students are <u>NOT</u> to organise their own placements
- Each student must read and agree to abide by the Professional Experience Policies and Procedures document prior to every professional experience

#### PRAC - Professional Experience Registration

- You will receive an email regarding registration for any Professional Experiences (prac) courses through <u>InPlace</u> requesting:
  - Current semester address needs to be up to date in mySi-net
  - Mode of transport
  - Conflict of Interest e.g. family members in attendance or employed at a particular school

- We <u>DO NOT</u> collect individual preferences. Exceptional circumstances will be considered on a case by case basis e.g. medical conditions

## Key important features – Blue Cards

- All students must have a valid Blue Card.
- Applications, renewals and cards from other organisations must be registered/applied for via the blue card online application portal: see instructions on the School of Education page <a href="https://education.uq.edu.au/our-students/blue-card-information">https://education.uq.edu.au/our-students/blue-card-information</a>
- Remains current for three years

- Student's responsibility to check the renewal date
- Must carry the card on you at all times when on placements or visiting schools
- Failure to have a valid Blue Card can result in large fines for the University, the School and the student
- No Blue Card = No prac!



## Key important features – LANTITE

Facilitated by ACER - Initial teacher education students' personal literacy and numeracy skills to ensure teachers are well equipped to meet the demands of teaching

**All** preservice teachers must meet the benchmark of both LANTITE tests to be eligible to graduate.


