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
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The Brisbane River pattern from A Guidance Through Time by Casey Coolwell and Kyra Mancktelow.





Time Management - 13 weeks goes quuickly

Course enrolment & tutorial sign-on


- Log into <u>Starting at UQ</u>. Go to mySI-net to enrol in courses.
