

### This Program Planner is for Bachelor of Social Science (BSocSc) students starting in Semester 1, 2024

#### **Important Information**

- At UQ we refer to your degree as a program and a subject as a course.
- Most UQ courses are usually 2 units in value.
- If you are a full-time student, you will undertake 8 units (4 courses) each semester.
- A course can only count once towards your program (Core Courses, Major, General Electives).

#### The BSocSc Requirements

The BSocSc program comprises 48 units over three components that you will complete over three years:

- BSocSc Core courses (16 units/8 Courses)
- One BSocSc Major (16 units/8 Courses)
- BSocSc Elective Courses (16 units/8 Courses)

You will complete a minimum of one BSocSc Major (16 units/8 Courses).

You will also complete 16 units for BSocSc Elective Courses, and you can decide where these courses come from – they can be either:

- General Electives which are other courses from the BSocSc course list or from other undergraduate course lists; or
- Second BSocSc Major.

#### **Additional Rules**

The BSocSc has an Additional Rule that a student must complete their first 4 units (two courses) from courses listed in the **BSocSc Core Courses** or **BSocSc Majors** sections.

For full time students this will require that two of your four courses in your first semester will need to be from your BSocSc Core Courses and/or BSocSc Major. The remaining two courses can also be from these sections or from General Electives.

#### Selecting Plans in mySI-net

A plan is a prescribed combination of courses within a program being either a Major, Extended Major or Minor. In the BSocSc you will need select at least one BSocSc Major.

Ensure the plan(s) for your program are correctly listed in your <u>mySI-net</u> account. If you require assistance selecting your plan(s), follow these <u>instructions</u>.

### How to use this Program Planner

This Program Planner assists you to draft an enrolment plan to complete the requirements of Bachelor of Social Science as a full-time student over three years. To assist the BSocSc Core Courses are pre-filled in the sequence they should be completed.

Read the program rules below, then add the courses that you are required to complete for your major(s) and General Electives. You will find your plan and course requirements on the Programs and Courses <u>website</u>. Don't forget to save your BSocSc Program Planner document to your files.



If you are an international student with a credit arrangement from one of our partnering institutions, we have tailored study plans to assist you in completing your program requirements at UQ.

#### Course Scheduling

This program planner is intended as a guide only and is based on current scheduling of courses for 2024. Students should note that scheduling can change from year to year. You are advised to check the scheduling for the current year and contact the Faculty for advice if course scheduling has changed.

#### **Bachelor of Social Science - Additional Rules**

1. Progression through program

You must complete your first 4 units from courses in the **BSocSc Core Courses** and/or **BSocSc Majors** sections.

- 2. Course selection
- Selected courses must include at most 24 units at level 1.
- Selected courses must include at least 8 units at level 3.

#### **Cross-Listed courses**

As a course can only be credited once, the following course replacements are approved in circumstances in which a course is listed in more than one plan (minor or major).

- a. Where a course is compulsory in one plan
  - The course must be counted towards the plan in which it is compulsory. A replacement course, at the same level or higher, must then be selected from the other nominated plan.
- b. Where a course is compulsory in more than one plan
  - A replacement course from the other nominated plan at the same level or higher may be selected.
