





Program requirements

All UQ programs have requirements that must be met for graduation such as:

- the total number of units in relevant structures
- the number of units at various levels of study

Program and course requirements

Information for students commencing

2024

Complete 48 units comprising:

- · 32 units for BA Courses, and
- 16 units for BA Elective Courses

Selected courses must include at most 24 units at level 1.

Selected courses must include at least 8 units at level 3.

No more than 32 units may be completed from courses with the same discipline descriptor.

Study Areas

Nearly 50 study areas available in the BA:

- All but four study areas are available as majors
- Some study areas are available as extended majors
- Four study areas are available as minors only

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
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
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Structure of the single BA








What is a General Elective?


Courses that contribute to your degree, but not your majors, or extended major and minor.

- Can be from study areas outside of your majors, or extended major and minor
- Can also be used to complete another major or two minors or one minor and 8 units of electives
- Can take general electives outside the BA course list after completing 8 units from the BA course list
- Before attempting to enrol in an elective, check the pre-requisite requirements and/or restrictions that apply





Structure of dual programs – BA component







Where do I start – Single BA

If you are in the Single BA, keep your options open and explore

Example: Mary wants to major in International Relations and Philosophy, but she is also interested in Music and Criminology. She picks one compulsory introductory course from each major, and two other introductory courses as general electives. All of these are compulsory courses for the different majors. This gives her the chance to explore four majors at once!




Make sure to take Level 1 courses in your first semester, unless you have credit for prior learning



Where do I start – Dual degree

If you are in the dual degree, **get your foundation right**

Example: Xi is doing a Bachelor of Arts / Laws (Honours). In his BA, he wants to do an extended major in Art History and a minor in Sociology. He picks two introductory (Level 1) compulsory courses offered in Semester 1 for Law. Then he picks two introductory courses for his BA extended major and minor. This sets a good foundation for his study in future semesters.

Where do I start

You can find your program requirements on the **Bachelor of Arts** page.

It is important that you are familiar with these requirements so that you complete the program you want in the relevant amount of time.

Don't forget the 8-unit rule when choosing your courses in the BA. This means your first 8 units must be chosen from BA courses. This includes course from BA majors and minors and BA program electives. You cannot choose general elective courses outside of these areas for your first 8 units.




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
