- We need to know your specialisation so that we can ensure you get the opportunity to practice and be assessed teaching your specialisation while on placement.
- You record your specialisation via InPlace.



Key important features – Professional Experience

Year 1 Semester 1 – Introduction to Primary Professional Experience (10 days)

Year 2 Semester 2 – Primary Professional Experience 1 (15 days)

Year 3 Semester 2 – Primary Professional Experience 2 (20 days)

Year 4 Semester 2 – Primary Professional Experience 3 (35 days)



Key important features – Blue Cards

- All students must have a valid Blue Card.
- Applications, renewals and cards from other organisations must be registered/applied for via the blue card online application portal: see instructions on the School of Education page https://education.uq.edu.au/our-students/blue-card-information
- Blue Card is valid for three years Student's responsibility to check the renewal date
- Must carry the card on you at all times when on placements or visiting schools
- Failure to have a valid Blue Card can result in large fines for the University, the School and the student
- No Blue Card = No prac!

Your placement is based on the following data:

- Your current suburb and street address recorded on your InPlace Registration page, which may differ from your SINET TERM address
- Your mode of transport ticking public transport does not necessarily mean a closer school.
 You may be required to travel 90 minutes by public transport
- Your interest in attending faith-based schools (Catholic Education, Lutheran, etc)
- Conflict of Interest

- We do not collect individual preferences. Exceptional circumstances will be considered on a case-bycase basis.

Key important features – LANTITE

Facilitated by ACER - Initial teacher education students' personal literacy and numeracy skills to ensure teachers are well equipped to meet the demands of teaching

LANTITE 2024

The first three windows of 2024 (up to August 2024) are part of an important LANTITE trial.

For the duration of the trial (four test windows), enrolled ITE students in all states or territories will be able to have uncapped attempts. This means that candidates who attempt the test during the trial will not have their failed attempts recorded as attempts when the trial ends. If you meet the test standard during the trial, it will count for the purpose of meeting the standard.

If you attempt the test during the trial, you will also receive improved feedback in the form of a Described Proficiency Scale that describes skills tested and outlines skills required to achieve better results and progress from one band to the other.

To take advantage of uncapped test attempts during the trial, simply register for the test window you wish to sit.




