This Program Planner is for Bachelor of Music (Honours) (BMus(Hons)) students starting in 2024

Important Information

- At UQ we refer to your degree as a program and a subject as a course.
- Most UQ courses are usually 2 units in value.
- If you are a full-time student, you will undertake 8 units (4 courses) each semester.

BMus(Hons) Program Requirements

Your BMus(Hons) comprises 64 units that you will complete over four years.

- Complete 48 units comprising
 - o BMus(Hons) Core Course (26 units); AND
 - o BMus(Hons) Flexible Core Courses (12 units); AND
 - BMus(Hons) Research Courses (10 units)
 - o General Elective Courses (16 units)

General Elective Courses are courses that can be from other areas in the BMus(Hons) or from other undergraduate programs that do not have restrictions.

Additional Rules

- Selected courses must include at most 24 units at level 1.
- Selected courses must include at least 8 units at level 3

How to use this Program Planner

This Program Planner assists you in drafting an enrolment plan to complete the requirements of a Bachelor of Music (Honours) as a full-time student over four years.

Read the program rules below, then add the courses that you are required to complete for your BMus(Hons) Core, Flexible Core, Research and General Elective Courses. You can view the list of courses for your BMus(Hons) in the BMus(Hons) Program Requirements on the Programs and Courses website.

Don't forget to save your BMus(Hons) Program Planner document to your files.

Course Scheduling

This program planner is intended as a guide only and is based on current scheduling of courses in 2024. Students should note that course scheduling can change from year to year. Bachelor of Music (Honours) – Additional Rules

1. Selection of instrument

The head of school must approve changes to a student's chosen instrument.

2. Continuous enrolment

This program requires students to enrol pursuant to the expected program duration. Students must obtain prior approval to interrupt their studies. Resumption of studies may be subject to demonstrating competencies required for undertaking further study in the program. A student who fails to demonstrate competence may be required to undertake remediation which may include repeating courses and/or other requirements.

3. Exit awards

A student who withdraws from the program after completing 48 units, including all BMus(Hons) Core Courses, may apply for and be awarded the Bachelor of Music Studies.

4. Class of honours

Specific requirements apply to the awarding of honours in this program. The class of honours is calculated on the basis of the grade point average over 24 units of courses at level 3 or higher, comprising—

- (a) 8 units from Core Courses;
- (b) 6 units of the highest graded courses at level 3 or higher from Flexible Core Courses; and
- (c) 10 units from Research Courses.

Refer to the Bachelor Honours Degrees policy for more information.

5. Cross-Listed Courses

As a course can only be credited once, the following course replacement rules apply where a course is listed in more than one of your selected plans (minor, major or extended major).

- If the course is compulsory in more than one plan, it will be credited towards one plan only. You must replace the compulsory course in the second plan, with a course chosen from the second plan, at the same level or higher.
- If the course is compulsory in one plan only, it will be credited towards the plan in which it is
 compulsory. You must select the alternative course in the second plan, with a course chosen from the
 second plan, at the same level or higher.
- If the course is an elective in more than one plan, it will be credited towards one plan only.
