Changing Between Programs

- Semester one commencement only.
- Requires a QTAC application.
 - Once you complete at least 8 courses, QTAC will assess entry based on your GPA.
- Credit may be possible.
 - Courses need to fit within the structure of your new program.
 - If changing from the single to the dual, you will not be able to receive full credit for what you have done.
- If you are on a Scholarship you will need to apply to have your Scholarship transferred.
 - Requests due 15 December each year.
