### Major Options (Part B) 12 units

**Health and Society** – understand the social, cultural, economic and ethical factors influencing health and illness. Courses focus on how the health system functions and on the skills required to be a social science worker in the health sector.

**Social and Public Policy** – develop skills to analyse social and economic issues and develop, implement and evaluate policy solutions. Studies in this major will connect the social sciences to the world of today's politics.
