Major Options (Part B) 12 units

Development – gain a social science perspective on international and community development issues. You will focus on strategies to alleviate poverty and inequality, and to develop sustainable societies, communities and environments.

Environment and Society – study the intersections between human society and the environment. Analyse the ways in which environmental problems are tied to social, political, economic and cultural processes.

Health and Society – understand the social, cultural, economic and ethical factors influencing health and illness. Courses focus on how the health system functions and on the skills required to be a social science worker in the health sector.

Social and Public Policy – develop skills to analyse social and economic issues and develop, implement and evaluate policy solutions. Studies in this major will connect the social sciences to the world of today's politics.
