# **BJ Program overview and requirements**

### **BJ Program rules**

- 3-year full-time program (or part-time equivalent)
- 48 units required to complete the program

The 48 units comprise:

- 24 units for all <u>BJ Core Courses</u>, and
- 8 units from **BJ Flexible Core Courses**, and
- 16 units from <u>BJ Minors and/or General Elective</u> Courses

**<u>NOTE</u>**: Selected courses must include at most 24 units at Level 1.

# Planning your BJ program

- > Stick to Level 1 courses in your first year (e.g., JOUR1710, COMU1120, etc.).
- > In Semester 2, 2024 (make sure to enrol in:
  - □ JOUR1710 Journalistic Investigations Semester 2 only
  - **COMU1140 Multimedia Semester 1 & 2**
  - COMU1120 Media and Society Semester 1 & 2
  - **COMU1130 Data and Society Semester 2 only**





# Planning your BJ program

- > In Semester 1, 2025, you should enrol in the following courses:
  - **COMU1120 (Connectivity and Culture) Semesters 1 & 2**
  - **COMU1140 (Multimedia) Semesters 1 & 2**
  - □ JOUR1112 (Journalistic Investigation) -- Semester 1 only

\*\*\* Include -- <u>COMU1050 (Understanding the News)</u> -- from BJ Flexible Core Courses, in Semester 1, 2022, if it doesn't clash with your electives.



# Level 1 courses in BJ Core Course List

- Plan to complete all Level 1 courses in the BJ Core Courses in your First Year. <u>The Level 1 courses are</u>:
  - □ JOUR1112 (Journalistic Narratives) Semester 1 only
  - **COMU1120 (Media and Society) Semesters 1 & 2**
  - **COMU1140 (Multimedia) -- Semesters 1 & 2**
  - **COMU1130 (Connectivity and Culture) Semester 2 only**
  - □ JOUR1710 (Journalistic Investigation) -- Semester 2 only



# **Dual Degree**

- Dual degree in Journalism requires you to select courses from <u>BJ Core</u> <u>Courses</u> and the <u>BJ Flexible Core Courses</u> only.
- > You need 64 units to complete your dual degree program.
- You need to complete 32 units in Journalism and 32 units in another degree program (e.g., Arts or Communication).
- The BJ component courses should be selected as follows:
  - **24** units from the BJ Core Courses.
  - □ 8 units from the BJ Flexible Core Courses.

# **Terms explained**

<u>CENTRAL</u> -- Refers to central services that are offered to all UQ students (e.g. Student Services).

<u>FACULTY</u> -- Depending on what you are studying, you may study under one or more faculties – most often you'll study within HASS Faculty.

**HASS** -- Stands for Humanities and Social Sciences (Faculty).

<u>SCHOOL</u> -- Depending on the major you take, you'll also interact with different schools (i.e., the home of your courses). There are 7 Schools in HASS Faculty.


## **Terms explained**

**PROGRAM** – We call the overall degree you're studying a program (e.g., BJ).

**STUDY PLAN** -- Depending on the program, you can choose from three different study plans:

<u>MINOR</u> – A Minor is quite short and gives you a taster of a study area. A minor is made up of 8 units. Double Minor is 16 units.

MAJOR – A Major gives you good depth in a study area.

**EXTENDED MAJOR** – This is designed to help you do a deep dive into a study area.



## **Terms explained**

<u>COURSES</u> -- You'll enrol in courses in order to start studying at UQ.

Generally, a course is made up of 2 units (i.e., the value of one course) but this sometimes varies.

There are 2 types of courses, namely:

**<u>COMPULSORY COURSE</u>** -- This means you have to do that course.

**ELECTIVE COURSE** – This means you can choose from a range of different courses.



## **Terms explained**

<u>COURSE PROFILE (CP)</u> -- Gives you all the information about the specific courses in which you enrol (including readings, learning activities, and assessment).

**BLACKBOARD** – This is UQ's learning management system where you'll be able to access regular course information and updates.
