

## Transferring from the BA to another UQ degree

Information for domestic students planning to transfer from Bachelor of Arts (BA) to

## Bachelor of Arts/Bachelor of Laws (Honours) (BA/LLB(Hons)) or Bachelor of Laws (Honours) (LLB(Hons))

The sample enrolment plan below is for students who are studying in the Bachelor of Arts (BA) in 2025 who hope to:

- transfer into the Bachelor of Laws (Honours) in 2026; or
- add Laws (Honours) as a dual degree with Arts in 2026.

Please note that the Bachelor of Laws (Honours) (and associated dual programs) do not have a Semester 2 admission and therefore you will not be able to change prior to Semester 1 of the following year.

This plan has been approved by the Faculty of Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences, and the Faculty of Business, Economics and Law and is intended as a guide only. The suggested courses are not compulsory, and many others are available.

## **Remember:**

- To satisfy the Bachelor of Arts program rules, in their first year of study all BA students must complete their first 8 units of courses the BA course list (this excludes General Elective Courses). - You must satisfy subject prerequisites AND obtain grades that will derive the required ATAR/entry rank for the *relevant program*. These are often best achieved by enrolling in courses you enjoy and therefore should consider your choices carefully. You may wish to contact UQ Admissions to discuss how your entry rank will be calculated on the basis of your academic history.
- If you are intending to change programs in 2026, you should familiarise yourself with all relevant rules and procedures. More information is available from:
