



- Your specialisation will be completed through assessment tasks in specific courses. Your course coordinator will tell you when a task needs to be completed in your chosen specialisation



### How do I complete my specialisation?

- Three aspects taught and assessed through specific courses in your program (determined by your specialisation) to ascertain
  - Expert Content Knowledge
  - Pedagogical content knowledge
  - Highly effective classroom teaching
- We need to know your specialisation so that we can ensure you get the
  opportunity to practice and be assessed teaching your specialisation while on
  placement.
- You record your specialisation via InPlace.



### Key important features – Blue Cards

- All students must have a valid Blue Card.
- Applications, renewals and cards from other organisations must be registered/applied for via the blue card online application portal: see instructions on the School of Education page <a href="https://education.uq.edu.au/our-students/blue-card-information">https://education.uq.edu.au/our-students/blue-card-information</a>
- Blue Card is valid for three years Student's responsibility to check the renewal date
- Must carry the card on you at all times when on placements or visiting schools
- Failure to have a valid Blue Card can result in large fines for the University, the School and the student
- No Blue Card = No prac!

  - You may be required to travel 90 minutes by public transport
- Your interest in attending faith-based schools (Catholic Education, Lutheran, etc)
- Conflict of Interest, e.g. you already work at the school.

- The University is governed by an Industrial Agreement where students are <u>NOT</u> to organise their own placements.
- Each student must read and agree to abide by the <u>Professional Experience Policies and Procedures</u> document prior to every professional experience.







