Communication for Social Change

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Study Communication for Social Change at the only Australian university to offer this emerging field of study.

You'll explore the different ways in which communication can be leveraged to bring about change in attitudes, behaviour and knowledge in individuals and communities. You'll analyse the ways participation can make a difference in the planning, implementation and evaluation of development processes, the key role played by culture in social change, and contemporary uses of community media and information and communications technologies in the facilitation of change. Importantly, you'll strengthen critical skills, develop capacities for work in the state, inter-governmental and NGO sectors, and build research excellence.

Strategic Communication

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This field provides the skills of professionally analysing communication situations and designing solutions to communication problems. You'll also learn the skills required to plan and implement a professional public relations campaign (including goal-setting, budgeting and evaluation), the skills of audience and public opinion analysis, a range of communication theories, and an understanding of how globalisation and the emerging information economy impacts public relations practices.



- Please: Do <u>NOT</u> apply to the Thesis, or Industry Placement (COMU7015) courses in your first semester. Wait until you take core and Field of Study courses...
- Note: CSC courses should be selected when you (a) have opted for the CSC field of study; or (b) as an elective if you want to learn about this field, and/or you have some background knowledge of CSC...You may take other electives in our list too.

Associate Professor, Jane Johnston will explain COMU7015 - When and how you can take it.

Prerequisite

Students must have completed at least two but preferably four Field of Study courses in their specific Field of Study to be eligible to undertake COMU7015. **Recommended prerequisite**

A GPA of 5.5 is generally required to be allowed to take this course. The required courses should minimally include the following - Communication for Social Change Field of Study: COMU7000 and COMU7013. Strategic Communication Field of Study: COMU7301, COMU7302, COMU7304.

Placement and Work Experience Insurance

All UQ Students can access up to 30 days of Work Experience (not for course credit) Insurance per calendar year.

- **Placement Insurance** is also available for placement activities that are course requirements.
- Travel insurance is also available in certain circumstances for both Work Experience and Placements
- School approval is essential prior to undertaking Work Experience or Placement activity in order to access Insurance.
 - The activity type will determine the Insurance process.
