#### **PROGRAM GUIDELINES**

You must complete a total of 48 units for the program.

At least 28 units must be at Advanced Level (Level 2 or Level 3 course eg. COMU2XXX or COMU3XXX)

#### **BACHELOR OF JOURNALISM REQUIREMENTS:**

- ❖ 48 units under the BJ course list including -
  - 24 units core courses from Part A; and
  - 8 units from Part B; and
  - 16 units of Electives

#### **CREDIT ARRANGEMENT**

- ❖ You will receive 16 units of elective credit (6 units level 1 plus 10 units level 2) on the basis of your previous studies

**As you have received 16 units of credit, you will have 32 units remaining to complete the Bachelor of Journalism program, comprising of:**

- 24 units of core courses from Part A (COMU1120, COMU1130, COMU1140, JOUR1112, JOUR1710, COMU2120, COMU2130, COMU2160, JOUR2221, WRIT2000, JOUR3401, JOUR3000)
- 8 units chosen from Part B (COMU2140, COMU2170, JOUR2000, JOUR3222, JOUR3801)
