## Program Requirements

### Bachelor of Arts component:

- 32 units from the BA course list (courses listed under BA majors), comprising either
  - Two majors from Year 7-12 Teaching Areas\*; or
  - A major from Year 7-12 Teaching Areas and a major from Senior Specialist Teaching Areas; or
  - The specialisation in Music from Year 7-12 Teaching Areas.

You must choose BA Majors listed on the last pages of this document to be eligible for entry into the Professional Year.

### Bachelor of Education (Secondary) component:

- 32 units from the BEd(Sec) List, comprising:
  - 16 units for all BEd(Sec) Core Courses
  - 8 units for all BEd(Sec) Professional Year Core Courses
  - 8 units from BEd(Sec) Professional Year Curriculum Studies Courses

## Program Guidelines

The BEd(Sec) Core Courses teach issues pertinent to teaching and schooling and are completed in conjunction with the requirements of the BA program. The BEd(Sec) Professional Year Core Courses and Professional Year Curriculum Studies Courses develop professional expertise required for teaching and can only be commenced when the BA and BEd Core Course requirements have been met.

This planner is intended as a guide only and is based on current scheduling of courses. Students should note that scheduling can change from year to year. You are advised to check the scheduling for the current year and contact the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences for advice if course scheduling has changed.

	<b>OR Chinese Translation and Interpreting Major (16 units)</b>	This stream will allow students who are native speakers of Chinese to meet the eligibility requirements for teaching Chinese as a second language.	
<b>Drama</b>	<b>Drama Major (16 units)</b>	Select courses that incorporate practice and theory.	Students in Queensland high schools study dramatic languages (elements of drama, skills of performance, styles and their conventions, contexts and texts) and dramatic perspectives (heritage — before 1980, and contemporary — after 1980).
<b>English</b>	<b>English Major (16 units)</b>	Select a combination of English Literature (a minimum of four courses) and Media Studies courses from the English major list.  The School of Education strongly advises students to complete ENGL2060 (Shakespeare and His Contemporaries) and ENGL3100 (Australian Literature).	Students should consider the following points when selecting their courses: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Select broad English literature courses that cover a range of styles.</li> <li>▪ Include some study in Australian literature and Shakespeare.</li> <li>▪ Useful Media Studies topics include Introduction to Film and Television; Australian Cinema; Film Movements and Genres.</li> </ul>

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<b>Geography</b>	<b>Geography Major (16 units)</b>	Select courses in both physical and cultural areas, covering topics such as geomorphology, settlement and economic geography, bio-geography, people and the environment, geographical studies of development and Australian geographical inquiries.	
<b>German</b>	<b>German Major (16 units)</b>	Students should consult <a href="https://courseplacements.languages-cultures.uq.edu.au">https://courseplacements.languages-cultures.uq.edu.au</a> to determine their starting point and receive more detailed information about the courses to complete according to their language level.	Students must demonstrate sufficient productive and receptive competence in the language to model the grammar and functions necessary to teach the topics in the QCAA senior syllabus.
<b>History</b>	<b>Ancient History / History Major (16 units)</b>	Select courses in both Ancient History (ANCH) and Modern History (HIST). Courses that cover a wide range of civilisations and time periods are most suitable.  The School of Education recommends that students completing the first year level course in Greek History (ANCH1240) take a second level course in Roman History. Similarly, it is recommended that students completing the first year level course in Roman History (ANCH1250) take a second level course in Greek History.	It is highly recommended that topics in both Greek and Roman history be covered for Ancient History. It is recommended that Modern History topics should include Australian history and other histories where possible. Students should avoid concentrating on one country/region's history as a breadth of knowledge across ancient and modern history and country/region is required.

<b>Essential Mathematics, General Mathematics, Mathematical Methods, Specialist Mathematics</b>	<b>Mathematics Major (16 units)</b>	A broad combination of courses in pure maths and applied maths.	It is <b>strongly</b> advised to include MATH1061 Discrete Mathematics and recommended to include STAT2203 Probability Models & Data Analysis, MATH3202 Operations Research and MATH3401 Complex Analysis. It is advised to select courses that provide breadth in multiple fields of mathematics, including mathematical applications.
