

TRIN7800 Thesis in Translation and Interpreting Studies

This course builds on TRIN7110 Theoretical Studies in Translation and Interpreting (taken in the 1st Semester) and TRIN7320 Research in Translation and Interpreting Studies (taken in the 3rd Semester) and furthers students' research ability.

Students will be expected to conduct an independent research project under supervision and write a thesis of about 10,000 words.

To be eligible, students must have a minimum GPA of 6 in the MATI program and write a research proposal. If their application is approved, they would need to choose two other courses from the 4th Semester course list in consultation with the program convenor.




