## Program Requirements

You must complete a total of 64 units for the program.

- 10 units for all BAdvHum(Hons) Core Courses, and
- 38 units from –
  - BAdvHum(Hons) Western Civilisation Extended Major, and
  - 14 units of general electives, and
- 16 units from BAdvHum(Hons) Honours Courses

**NB:** A student must take at least one of the following as an elective for the extended major in Western Civilisation:

- WCIV2700 Western Political Thought
- WCIV2800 The Rule of Law
- WCIV2900 Rights and Freedoms

Your general electives can come from almost any undergraduate program at UQ providing:

- you have met the prerequisites;
- they are not incompatible with any of the courses in your program; and
- they are not restricted courses (e.g. cannot be Bachelor of Medicine, Law and some Language courses).

To ensure you are meeting the requirements, you should refer to the Program Rules found on UQ's [Programs and Courses](#) website for the program, within the 'Courses and requirements' button.
