

# What is policy and why study it?

- **The skills and practices of policymaking**, and especially the design, implementation and evaluation of policy. What are the skills of an effective policymaker? And how can we better address the diverse and complex policy problems that state and non-state actors face?
- **An ability to take a power-critical view of policymaking.** How does *politics* shape policy? What are the broader social, economic and cultural forces that shape and constrain the work of the policymaker? And how, when moments of change present themselves, might policy be ‘done differently’?



**MGPP students may also complete up to 4 units (2 courses) from outside of this list, from other schools and faculties within UQ, with the approval of the program convenor.**

# Course variation

Up to 2 variations in Masters program

Courses outside of the approved program list requires a variation request form

Unless extenuating circumstances can be clearly demonstrated, variations to a major or program will not be approved for:

- Compulsory courses or
- Undertaking another course in lieu of a previously failed compulsory course.



# Course enrolment

*A student may enrol in courses up to the following limits:*

- For a summer semester — 6 units
- Other semesters — 10 units — if the student gained a GPA of 4.5 or above in the most recent semester of full-time enrolment; or
- 8 units — if the student gained a GPA of less than 4.5 in the most recent semester of full-time enrolment.

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


