PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS:

You must complete a total of 64 units from the BCCJ(Hons) List comprising –

- 34 units from Part A; and
- 14 units from Part B; and
- 16 units from Part C.

Notes:

- A student must not enrol in courses from Part C of the program until gaining credit for all courses in Parts A and B.
- A student must commence Part C of the program in semester one of the academic year and complete this part without interruption.
- To enrol in courses in Part B following an interruption from studies, students must satisfy the executive dean and head of school that the student has the competencies required for undertaking further study in the program.
- Unless approved by the Executive Dean, a student must complete Part C on a full-time basis.
- A student must complete either the thesis course or criminal justice case study in Part C of the course list.
- To be eligible to enrol in the thesis course in part C, a student must have a GPA of 5.5. for all courses credited towards Part A and B of the BCCJ(Hons) course list.
