PROGRAM GUIDELINES

- ❖ You must complete a total of 48 units for the program.
- No more than 32 units may be from a single field eg. POLS or ENGL
- ❖ At least 28 units must be at Advanced Level (Level 2 or Level 3 course eg. ENGL2XXX or ENGL3XXX) which must include at least 6 units at Level 3.
- ❖ A minor consists of 8 units from one major list with a maximum of 4 units at introductory level and must include a gateway course and a cornerstone course.
- ❖ A course can only count towards one major or minor.

BACHELOR OF ARTS REQUIREMENTS:

- ❖ 48 units under the Bachelor of Arts course list comprising
 - two single majors; or
 - one extended major and a minor from a different major list; or
 - a major and two minors; and
 - the balance of electives

CREDIT ARRANGEMENT

You have been granted 8 units of elective credit on the basis of your previous studies

As you have received 8 units of credit, you will have 40 units remaining to complete the Bachelor of Arts program, comprising of:

- either two single majors (16 units per major); or
- one extended major (24 units) and a minor (8 units) from a different major list; or
- a major (16 units) and two minors (8 units per minor); and
- 8 units of electives

OR

- Psychology extended major (28 units) and a minor (8 units) from a different major list;
 and
- 4 units of electives

Please note that if you wish to study a language, please consult the School of Languages and Cultures <u>Language</u> <u>course placement advisor</u> on-line prior to completing courses.
