



**Information for students planning to transfer from Bachelor of Arts to
Bachelor of Arts/Laws (Honours)
or
Bachelor of Laws (Honours)**

The sample enrolment plan below is for students who are studying in the Bachelor of Arts in 2019 who hope to transfer into the Bachelor of Laws (Honours), or add Laws (Honours) as a dual degree with Arts, in 2020. This plan has been approved by the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, and the Faculty of Business, Economics and Law and is intended as a guide only. The suggested courses are not compulsory, and many others are available.

Remember:

- To satisfy the Bachelor of Arts program rules, in their first year of study all full time BA students must complete their first 8 units of courses from Part A or B of the BA List (see www.uq.edu.au/study to check the full Bachelor of Arts Program Requirements).
- You will need to satisfy subject prerequisites AND obtain grades that will derive the required OP/entry rank for the *relevant program*. These are often best achieved by enrolling in courses you enjoy and therefore you should consider your choices carefully. You may wish to contact UQ Admissions to discuss how your entry rank will be calculated on the basis of your academic history.
- International students should note that the LLB (Hons) has a higher English Proficiency entry of: IELTS (Academic Module) Overall Band Score of 7 with sub-band scores of writing 7, speaking 7.
- If you are intending to change programs in 2020 you should familiarise yourself with all relevant rules and procedures. More information is available from:

- 'Transferring Programs' sessions run during Orientation - check the *Orientation Guide* for details. To apply for the single Bachelor of Laws (Hons) or the dual Bachelor of Arts/Bachelor of Laws (Honours) you must submit a new application through QTAC if you are a domestic student. No credit can be applied towards the LLB (Hons) component of the dual BA/LLB(Hons), however you may apply to receive up to 8 units of non-law elective credit towards the single LLB(Hons).
