# BEd(Primary) program structure

### Important information:

- At the start of the program students must obtain a Blue Card and keep it active for the entire program.
- Students must enrol full-time, and undertake practicum courses to complete the program.

## BEd(Sec) dual program structure

The BEd(Sec) program must be taken as a dual degree.

- BBusMan/BEd(Sec)
- BSc/BEd(Sec)
- BMath/BEd(Sec)
- BMus (Hons)/BEd(Sec)\*\*

#### Important information:

- \*Students must complete the requirements of their other program, and 16 units from Part A in the BEd(Sec) before enrolling in courses from Part B of the BEd(Sec) list.
- \*\*Note that the BMus (Hons)/BEd(Sec) is of longer duration
- At the start of the program students must obtain a Blue Card and keep it active for the entire program.
- A student must successfully complete the Literacy and Numeracy Test for Initial Teacher Education Students (LANTITE) as set by the Australian Institute for Teaching and School Leadership (AITSL), during their program.
