

## Transferring from the BA to another UQ degree

Information for students planning to transfer from Bachelor of Arts to

### Bachelor of Economics/Bachelor of Arts Bachelor of Economics

The sample enrolment plans below are for students who are studying in the Bachelor of Arts in 2019 who hope to transfer into the Bachelor of Economics, or add Economics as a dual degree with Arts, mid-year, 2019 or hope to transfer into the Bachelor of Economics or Bachelor of Economics/Bachelor of Arts in 2020. These plans have been approved by the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences and the Faculty of Business, Economics and Law, and are provided as a guide only. The suggested courses are not compulsory, and many others are available.

#### Remember:

- To satisfy the Bachelor of Arts program rules, in their first year of study all full time BA students must complete their first 8 units of courses from Part A or B of the BA List (see <https://my.uq.edu.au/programs-courses/> to check the full Bachelor of Arts Program Requirements).
- You will need to satisfy subject prerequisites AND obtain grades that will derive the required OP/entry rank for the relevant program. These are often best achieved by enrolling in courses you enjoy and therefore you need to consider your choices carefully. You may wish to contact UQ Admissions to discuss how your entry rank will be calculated on the basis of your academic history.
- If you are intending to change programs you should familiarise yourself with all relevant rules and procedures. More information is available from:

If successful in securing a place in the Bachelor of Economics (BEcon), you may apply for credit for the courses indicated in bold above, plus 4 units of level 1 general electives in accordance with the BEcon rules (for the single BEcon program). You cannot receive credit for level 1 general electives in the dual BEcon/BA.

**NOTE:** MATH1040 will meet the Mathematics B prerequisite for entry to the BEcon but will NOT be granted as credit towards the BEcon.
