PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS:

You must complete a total of 80 units for the program.

Bachelor of Humanities Requirements:

- ❖ 32 units from the BHum List including –
 - 8 units for Core Courses; and
 - 24 units for the extended major in Western Civilisation

Bachelor of Laws (Honours) Requirements:

- ❖ 48 units from the LLB(Hons) List including –
 - 36 units of compulsory courses from Part A; and
 - 12 units of elective courses from Part B.

NB: A student must take at least one of the following as an elective for the extended major in Western Civilisation:

- WCIV2700 Western Political Thought
- WCIV2800 The Rule of Law
- WCIV2900 Rights and Freedoms
