PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS:

To complete the program with an extended major in Western Civilisation you must complete a total of 64 units from the BAdvHum(Hons) List comprising –

- 8 units for Part A;
- 24 units for the extended major in Western Civilisation from Part B;
- 14 units of general electives which may be from Parts B or C of the BAdvHum(Hons) List or any other course list; and
- 18 units from Part C.

Your general electives can come from almost any undergraduate program at UQ providing you have:

- met the prerequisites;
- they are not incompatible with any of the courses in your program; and
- they are not restricted courses (e.g. cannot be Bachelor of Medicine, Law and some Language courses).

Notes:

- A student must not enrol in courses from Part C of the program (other than HUMN3300) until gaining a minimum GPA of 5.5 for all courses in Parts A and B.
- A student must commence Part C of the program (other than HUMN3300) in semester one of the academic year and complete this part without interruption.
- A student must take at least one of the following as an elective for the extended major in Western Civilisation:
 - WCIV2700 Western Political Thought
 - WCIV2800 The Rule of Law
 - WCIV2900 Rights and Freedoms
