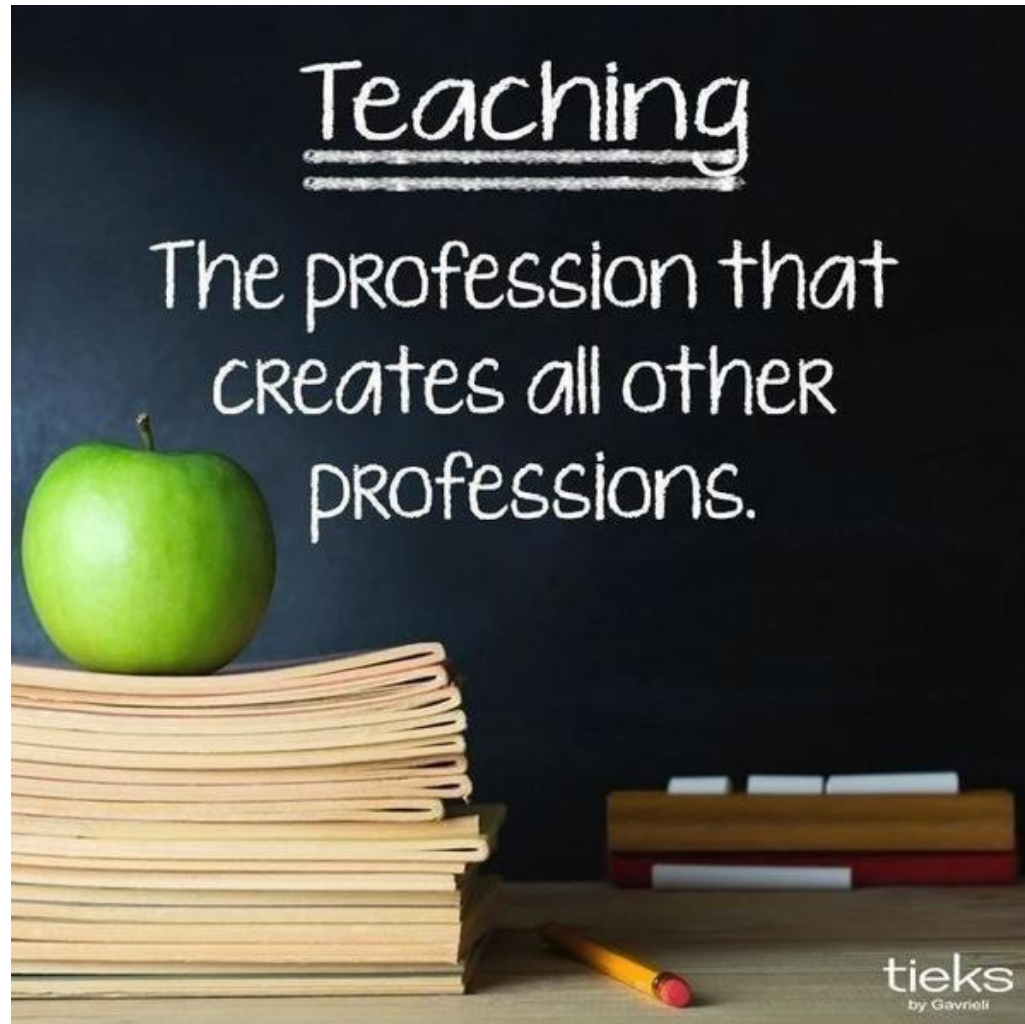

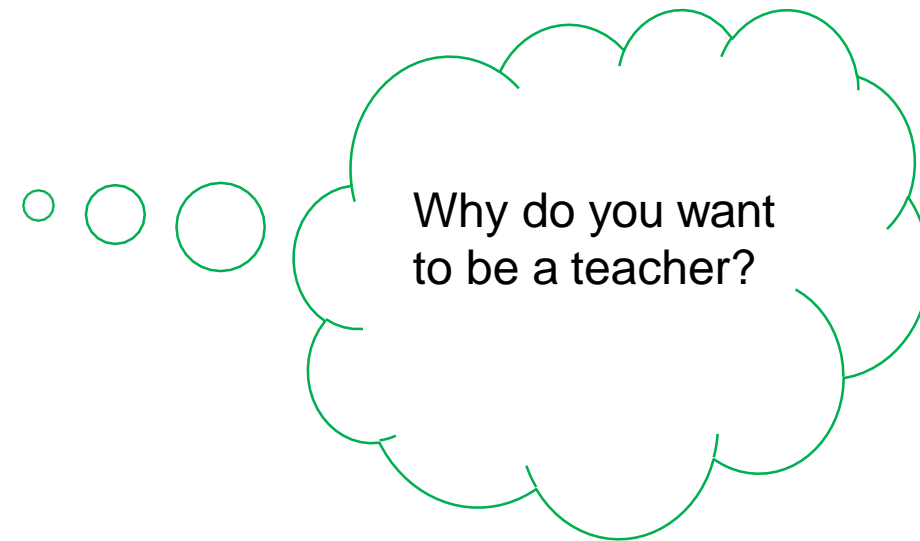

# Key important features – Professional Experience

Year 1 Semester 2 – Introduction to Primary Professional Experience (10 days)

Year 2 Semester 2 – Primary Professional Experience 1 (15 days)

Year 3 Semester 2 – Primary Professional Experience 2 (20 days)

Year 4 Semester 2 – Primary Professional Experience 3 (35 days)

## Key important features – Blue Cards

- All students must have a valid Blue Card.
- Applications, renewals and cards from other organisations must be registered/applied for via the blue card online application portal: see instructions on the School of Education page <https://education.uq.edu.au/our-students/blue-card-information>
- Blue Card is valid for three years
- Student's responsibility to check the renewal date
- Must carry the card on you at all times when on placements or visiting schools
- Failure to have a valid Blue Card can result in large fines for the University, the School and the student
- No Blue Card = No prac!

Your placement is based on the following data:

- Your current suburb and street address recorded on your InPlace Registration page which may differ from your SINET TERM address
- Your mode of transport – ticking public transport does not necessarily mean a closer school. You may be required to travel 90 minutes by public transport.
- Your interest in attending faith-based schools (Catholic Education, Lutheran etc)
- Conflict of Interest
- Once verified, your details cannot be changed without an email to [education@uq.edu.au](mailto:education@uq.edu.au)
- Please update your InPlace registration page with above information ASAP

We do not collect individual preferences. Exceptional circumstances will be considered on a case by case basis.

# Key important features – LANTITE

Facilitated by ACER - Initial teacher education students' personal literacy and numeracy skills to ensure teachers are well equipped to meet the demands of teaching

**All** preservice teachers must meet the benchmark of both LANTITE tests to be eligible to graduate.

There are usually 4 test windows a year, window 1 has closed, however, registrations open for test window 2 on 4 April 2023 and close on 17 April 2023. The test window will be held from 8 May 2023 – 21 May 2023.

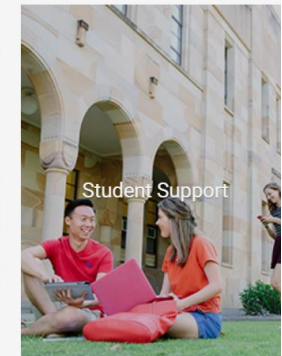
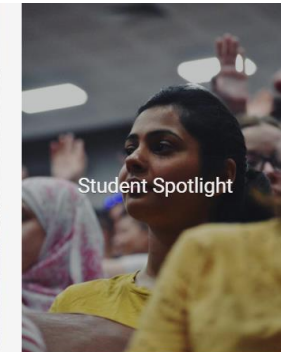
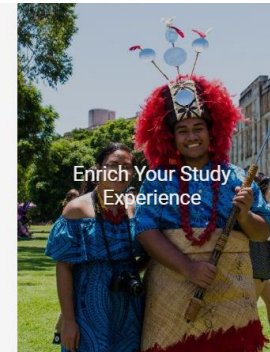
