Program Structure

- Your Education degree provides the skills, knowledge and practical experience to teach in schools

This pre-service teacher education program is available only as a dual degree. Students completing a dual degree have the opportunity to complete two degrees in less time than if each was studied separately. The Bachelor of Education (Secondary) offers school based learning and draws on the latest research into effective teaching, ensuring graduates are well equipped to teach. Students completing a dual degree with education are prepared for secondary school teaching, or training in business or industry. Teaching is a challenging and rewarding career, with secondary school teachers in demand worldwide. Teaching areas include Ancient History/History, Chinese, Chinese Translation and Interpreting; Criminology, Drama, Economics, English, Film and TV Studies, French, Geography, German, Japanese, Mathematics, Media and Digital Cultures, Music, Psychology and Spanish.

The non-education degree undertaken provides the content knowledge for two teaching areas, while the education degree provides the skills and knowledge for the teaching of the content.

Organisation of Professional Experience

- The School of Education Placement Officers organise ALL professional experience placements
- The University is governed by an Industrial Agreement where students are <u>NOT</u> to organise their own placements
- Each student must read and agree to abide by the Professional Experience Policies and Procedures document prior to every professional experience



PRAC - Professional Experience Registration

- You will receive an email regarding registration for any Professional Experiences (prac) courses through <u>InPlace</u> requesting:
 - $_{\odot}$ Current semester address needs to be up to date in mySi-net
 - \circ Mode of transport
 - Conflict of Interest e.g. family members in attendance or employed at a particular school

- We <u>DO NOT</u> collect individual preferences. Exceptional circumstances will be considered on a case by case basis e.g. medical conditions

Key important features – Blue Cards

- All students must have a valid Blue Card.
- Applications, renewals and cards from other organisations must be registered/applied for via the blue card online application portal: see instructions on the School of Education page <u>https://education.uq.edu.au/our-students/blue-</u> <u>card-information</u>
- Remains current for three years

Student's responsibility to check the renewal

date

- Must carry the card on you at all times when on placements or visiting schools
- Failure to have a valid Blue Card can result in large fines for the University, the School and the student
- No Blue Card = No prac!



Key important features – LANTITE

Facilitated by ACER - Initial teacher education students' personal literacy and numeracy skills to ensure teachers are well equipped to meet the demands of teaching

<u>All</u> preservice teachers must meet the benchmark of both LANTITE tests to be eligible to graduate.

If you haven't registered for window 1, or successfully completed the test previously, **<u>please register for window 2</u>** to ensure that graduation checks can be completed on time.

YOU MUST TAKE THE LANTITE TEST IN YOUR FIRST YEAR

Course enrolment & tutorial sign-on

- Log into <u>Starting at UQ</u>. Go to mySI-net to enrol in courses.
- Once you are enrolled in a course, you should be able to see if tutorial sign-on is required. If not, this will be covered in your first lecture.
- If you have a problem with signon, email your course coordinator.
