# Changes to the Master of Communication, effective 2023

**A/Prof. Jane Johnston, Discipline Director, Communication Studies**

1. A new course **COMU7400 Leadership and Communication Management (#2 units)** has replaced **COMU7002 Communication Project (#2 units)**. This new course will be undertaken by ALL students who are opting to do the Professional pathway (and not doing a thesis). Students doing the Thesis pathway may also take COMU7400 as an elective. **It is offered in both semesters.**
2. A new course **COMU7430 Corporate Social Responsibility** replaced **COMU7500 Ethics and Law for Communicators (semester 1)**. This is a compulsory course for students in the Strategic Communication field of study and can be chosen as an elective for those in the Communication for Social Change field of study.
3. **COMU7292 Communication Research Design is compulsory for ALL students.** However, for **those students completing the thesis it must be undertaken prior to the thesis** (i.e., it is a pre-req for COMU7009/7008/7007). For those students **NOT doing the thesis**, it may be undertaken **at any time** (i.e., it is not a pre-req for COMU7400).
4. **Entry into the thesis course requires a GPA of 5.5** and a formal [Expression of Interest](#) (Eoi), which should be forwarded to the course convenor Dr Aparna Hebbani.
