HASS	=	Humanities and Social Sciences (our Faculty)		
Faculty	=	Home of related Schools	e.g.	Humanities and Social Sciences
School	=	Home of related study areas	e.g.	School of Social Science
Program	=	Degree or study area	e.g.	Master of Development Practice
Course	=	Subject/Class	e.g.	ANTH7250
Unit (#)	=	Value of the course	e.g.	2 (almost always 2, SOSC7100 is 6)
Semester	=	Duration of courses	e.g.	approximately 16 weeks

Program Structure

The Postgraduate programs in Development Practice sets out a list of courses that students can choose from. Depending on which degree program you are following, you will need to design your enrolment according to the different parts of the program, progressing from introductory courses to more specialised.

The course lists and associated program rules are included in the Program and course requirement webpages on my.UQ.

Have a close look at these pages, they set out which courses you should take in order to progress through the program. While student choice via electives and variations to the program is celebrated in all its diversity, students should take careful note of recommendations made by teaching staff around which courses precede others.



Graduate Certificate in Development Practice

From the <u>course list</u>

Complete 8 units comprising:

- 8 units from GCDevPract Foundational Courses, or
- 8 units from GCDevPract Flexible Core courses and the GCDevPract Program Electives

Can be completed in 1 semester full time or equivalent part time



Master of Development Practice (#24)

From the <u>course list</u>

Complete 24 units comprising:

- •16 units for all MDevPract Core Courses, and
- •8 units from MDevPract Program Elective and Research Courses

Can be completed in 3 semesters full time or equivalent part time



Master of Development Practice (#32)

From the <u>course list</u>

Complete 32 units comprising:

- •8 units from MDevPract Foundational Courses, and
- •16 units for all MDevPract Core Courses, and
- •8 units from MDevPract Program Elective and Research Courses

Can be completed in 4 semesters full time or equivalent part time



UQ Program Planner

The Program Planner is a tool that allows you to plan courses for your program and ensure that the plan meets the program's completion rules and chosen structure.





Course enrolment & tutorial sign-on

- Log into <u>Starting at UQ</u>. Go to mySI-net to enrol in courses.
- Once you are enrolled in a course, you should be able to see what class allocations are required in myTimetable.

Textbooks

Wait until Week 1 to work out what textbooks you should get

- Buy: <u>The School Locker</u> or <u>Second-hand Texts &</u> <u>Stationary</u>
- Print: <u>UQ Print</u>
- Borrow: UQ Library



Enrolling, Tutorials and Class Allocations

- First stop: 'Starting at UQ'.
- You can add / drop your courses on SI-net
- myTimetable is used to preference and allocate into classes. If you have options for tutorial times, you can preference classes prior to the university running the class allocation process.
- New video tutorials for class timetabling <u>Enrolment and class allocation my.UQ University of</u> <u>Queensland</u>
- If there is a problem with class allocation, e-mail the relevant faculty area for the owner of the course e.g. HASS Faculty = <u>hass.mytimetable@uq.edu.au</u>
- If all else fails, myUQ has the answer or contact the School's student admin team: student.socsci@uq.edu.au
