Sometime education assistant and digital archivist – because museums are like that!






UQ staff teaching this semester

Program Structure

Graduate Certificate in Museum Studies

8 units of study, can be completed in 1 semester full time (if commencing in semester 1 only), or the part time equivalent. There is no entry in a Graduate Diploma in Museum Studies.

However should you commence the #24 Master of Museum studies and would like to exit early there is an exit Diploma. Completion is 16 units of study, without the research methods course or thesis.

Master of Museum Studies

24 units of study, can be completed in 3 semesters full time or the part time equivalent



Master of Museum Studies (#24)

Complete **24 units** comprising:

- 2 units for all MMusmSt Foundational Course, and;
- > 8 units for all MMusmSt Core Courses, and;
- > 8 units for all MMusmSt Research Courses, and;
- ➢ 6 units from MMusmSt Program Elective Courses;

Can be completed in 3 semesters full-time or equivalent part-time

Graduate Certificate in Museum Studies

- > 2 units from GCMusmSt Program Elective Courses

Can be completed in 1 semester full-time (if commencing Sem 1) or equivalent part-time (if commencing Sem 2)

Program Variations and different Electives

Program Variations are only considered in *exceptional circumstances*

Must be endorsed by the Program Director, and then approved at the Faculty level by the Associate Dean (Academic).

If you wish to pursue a Program Variation please email <u>student.socsci@uq.edu.au</u> in the first instance for advice.

Please note: Program Variations can take up to 6 weeks to assess.

Non-listed electives can be approved by the Program Director at the School level. Please seek approval from Diana and then email <u>student.socsci@uq.edu.au</u> with the details of the elective you would like to undertake. Once approved, a notation will appear on your studies report indicating that the elective has been approved towards the program. Please allow 5-10 business days for processing.



UQ Program Planner

The Program Planner is a tool that allows you to plan courses for your program and ensure that the plan meets the program's completion rules and chosen structure.





Course enrolment & tutorial sign-on

- Log into <u>Starting at UQ</u>. Go to mySI-net to enrol in courses.
- Once you are enrolled in a course, you should be able to see what class allocations are required in myTimetable.

Wait until Week 1 to work out what textbooks you should get

- You can add / drop your courses on SI-net
- myTimetable is used to preference and allocate into classes. If you have options for tutorial times, you can preference classes prior to the university running the class allocation process.


