

Transferring from the BA to another UQ degree

Information for students planning to transfer from Bachelor of Arts to

Bachelor of Speech Pathology (Honours)

The sample enrolment plans below are for students who are studying in the Bachelor of Arts in 2023 who hope to transfer into the Bachelor of Speech Pathology (Honours) in 2024. These plans have been approved by the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences and the Faculty of Health and Behavioural Sciences, and are provided as a guide only. The suggested courses are not compulsory, and many others are available.

Remember:

- To satisfy the Bachelor of Arts program rules, in their first year of study **all BA students must complete their first 8 units of courses the BA course list** with the exception of General Elective Courses (see <https://future-students.uq.edu.au/study/programs/bachelor-arts-2000> to check the full Bachelor of Arts Program Requirements).
- Students will need to satisfy subject prerequisites AND obtain grades that will derive the required OP/entry rank for the *relevant program*. These are often best achieved by enrolling in courses they enjoy and therefore should consider their choices carefully. Students may wish to contact UQ Admissions to discuss how their entry rank will be calculated on the basis of their academic history.
- Students intending to change programs in 2024 should familiarise themselves with all relevant rules and procedures. More information is available from:

Bachelor of Arts → Bachelor of Speech Pathology (Honours)
(Lacking year 12 science prerequisite)

To satisfy the science prerequisite, students must take 2 units (1 course) in biology or 2 units (1 course) in physics or chemistry across the year.

However, as BA students must complete their first 8 units of courses from the BA Course List, the only way to fulfil a science prerequisite as a Year 1 BA student is to complete BIOL1900 in Semester 1 or complete 8 units from the BA list then complete PHYS1171 or BIOL1020 in Semester 2 as non-BA electives.

*PHYS1171 and BIOL1020 are not on the BA course list and can only be studied in Semester 2 if 8 units from the BA course list are completed in Semester 1. If commencing a Bachelor of Arts in Semester 2 students will not be able to enrol in courses not on the BA course list (e.g. PHYS1171) as they will need to meet the first 8 unit Program Rule requirement.
