

## Transferring from the BA to another UQ degree

Information for students planning to transfer from Bachelor of Criminology and Criminal Justice (Honours) to

**Bachelor of Arts/Laws (Honours)**  
or  
**Bachelor of Laws (Honours)**

The sample enrolment plan below is for students who are studying in the Bachelor of Criminology and Criminal Justice (Honours) in 2023 who hope to transfer into the Bachelor of Laws (Honours) or Bachelor of Arts/Laws (Honours) in 2024. This plan has been approved by the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, and the Faculty of Business, Economics and Law and is intended as a guide only. The suggested courses are not compulsory, and many others are available.

### Remember:

- Students will need to satisfy subject prerequisites AND obtain grades that will derive the required OP/entry rank for the *relevant program*. These are often best achieved by enrolling in courses they enjoy and therefore should consider their choices carefully. Students may wish to contact UQ Admissions to discuss how their entry rank will be calculated on the basis of their academic history.
- International students should note that the LLB(Hons) has a higher English Proficiency entry of: IELTS (Academic Module) Overall Band Score of 7 with sub-band scores of writing 7, speaking 7, reading 6, listening 6.
- Students intending to change programs in 2024 should familiarise themselves with all relevant rules and procedures. More information is available from:
